43 44	reelected to the General Assembly, but resignation or removal from service in the General Assembly constitutes resignation or removal from service on the Committee.
44 45	A member continues to serve until a successor is appointed. A vacancy shall be filled by the
46	officer who made the original appointment.

48	(a) The Joint Legislative Veterans and Military Service Members Oversight Committee
49	shall examine and monitor, on a continuing basis, the programs, initiatives, and efforts for
50	veterans, service members, and their families in this State in order to improve accountability

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1	and to improve awareness of State programs for veterans, service members, and their families.
2	The Committee may:
3	(1) Review reports prepared by the Task Force for Veterans, Service Members,
4	and Their Families.
5	(2) Monitor and review the implementation of the statewide strategic plan for

7	(3) Study any other matter the Committee believes is related to its purpose.
8	(b) The Committee shall report to the General Assembly any recommendations it has no
9	later than December 31, 2017, and annually thereafter. The Committee shall submit a final
10	report to the General Assembly no later than April 1, 2022. A report to the General Assembly
11	may contain any legislation needed to implement a recommendation of the Committee.

13	(a) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
14	Representatives shall each designate a cochair of the Joint Legislative Veterans and Military
15	Service Members Oversight Committee. The Committee shall meet upon the joint call of the
16	<u>cochairs.</u>
17	(b) <u>A quorum of the Committee is nine members. Only recommendations, including</u>
18	proposed legislation, receiving at least eight affirmative votes may be included in a Committee
19	report to the General Assembly. While in the discharge of its official duties, the Committee has
20	the powers of a joint committee under G.S. 120-19 and G.S. 120-19.1 through G.S. 120-19.4.
21	(c) The cochairs of the Committee may call upon other knowledgeable persons or
22	experts to assist the Committee in its work.
23	(d) Members of the Committee shall receive subsistence and travel expenses as
24	provided in G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate. The Committee may contract for
25	consultants or hire employees in accordance with G.S. 120-32.02. The Legislative Services
26	Commission, through the Legislative Services Officer, shall assign professional staff to assist
27	the Committee in its work. Upon the direction of the Legislative Services Commission, the
28	Supervisors of Clerks of the Senate and of the House of Representatives shall assign clerical
29	staff to the Committee. The expenses for clerical employees shall be borne by the Committee.
