When the Department rejects a traffic impact analysis, the Department 1 2 shall provide the applicant written notice specifically setting forth the reason for rejection. 3 Effect of Rejection. – The time frames set forth in subsection (a) of this section shall (d) 4 reset upon rejection of a traffic impact analysis. The Department may authorize an applicant to 5 reuse the scope approved for a rejected traffic impact analysis if the applicant is submitting a 6 revised traffic impact analysis. The Department shall notify the applicant as to whether the 7 original scope may be used no later than five business days from the day the Department 8 receives notice from the applicant that the applicant plans to submit a revised traffic impact 9 analysis. 10 Appeal. – An applicant may appeal a rejection of a traffic impact analysis by (e) 11 providing written notice of appeal to the Chief Engineer no later than five business days from the day the applicant receives the written notice required under subsection (c) of this section. 12 No later than five business days from the day the Chief Engineer receives the written notice of 13 14 appeal, the Chief Engineer shall either affirm or overturn the rejection being appealed. If the rejection being appealed is overturned, the traffic impact analysis that was the subject of the 15 16 appeal shall be deemed complete. The Chief Engineer shall provide the appealing party with 17 written notice of the Chief Engineer's decision, specifically setting forth the reason if the 18 rejection being appealed is affirmed. A decision by the Chief Engineer shall be final and not 19 subject to further appeal. 20 (f) Criteria. – The Department shall develop and use criteria for determining the scope 21 of a traffic impact analysis and the completeness of a traffic impact analysis. The Department 22 shall post the criteria on its Web site. Prior to amending the criteria, the Department shall 23 consult with a working group that consists of engineers, local government representatives, local 24 transportation planning organization representatives, and other interested stakeholders identified by the Department. The Department shall provide at least 90 days' notice prior to the 25 effective date of any amendments to the criteria. The notice required under this subsection may 26 be satisfied by publishing the proposed amendments on the Department's Web site. 27 Report. - Beginning October 1, and annually thereafter, the Department shall 28 (g) 29 provide to the chairs of the Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee a report on 30 the number of times the Department failed during the year preceding the report to meet the time 31 frame set in subdivision (1) of subsection (a) of this section, including reasoning for each 32 failure." 33 **SECTION 2.** The Department of Transportation shall commence development of 34 the appeals process required under G.S. 136-93.1A(e), as enacted by Section 1 of this act. 35 **SECTION 3.** Section 1 of this act becomes effective October 1, 2017, and applies 36 to proposed scopes and traffic impact analyses submitted on or after that date. The remainder of

37 this act is effective when it becomes law.
