BILL SUMMARY:

Under current law, two or more local government units may create a regional council of governments by adopting identical concurrent resolutions. Any local government may join an existing regional council by ratifying its charter and by being admitted by a majority vote of the existing members. Regional councils may perform certain functions outlined in Part 2 of Article 20 of G.S. 160A.

The bill expands the duties that regional councils may perform by allowing municipalities to transfer the powers, duties, and responsibilities of a public housing authority to a regional council of government.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:

If a local government chooses to exercise the authority granted under the bill to transfer housing authority duties to a regional council, the local government may achieve minor cost savings by doing so. However, because the bill merely permits and does not require such action, the bill has no fiscal impact.
